

Undergraduate Minor for Nonmajors:

Students outside the professional program may choose the undergraduate minor (five courses, 15 credits) in cultural landscape studies to complement their major. A variety of courses consider the cultural landscape as an object, something to be studied for its own sake, and as a subject, as a means to understand society's relationship to natural systems. The study of cultural landscapes also includes perceptions of landscape, cultural ideas and values, and visible elements. Direct inquiries to Professor A.
